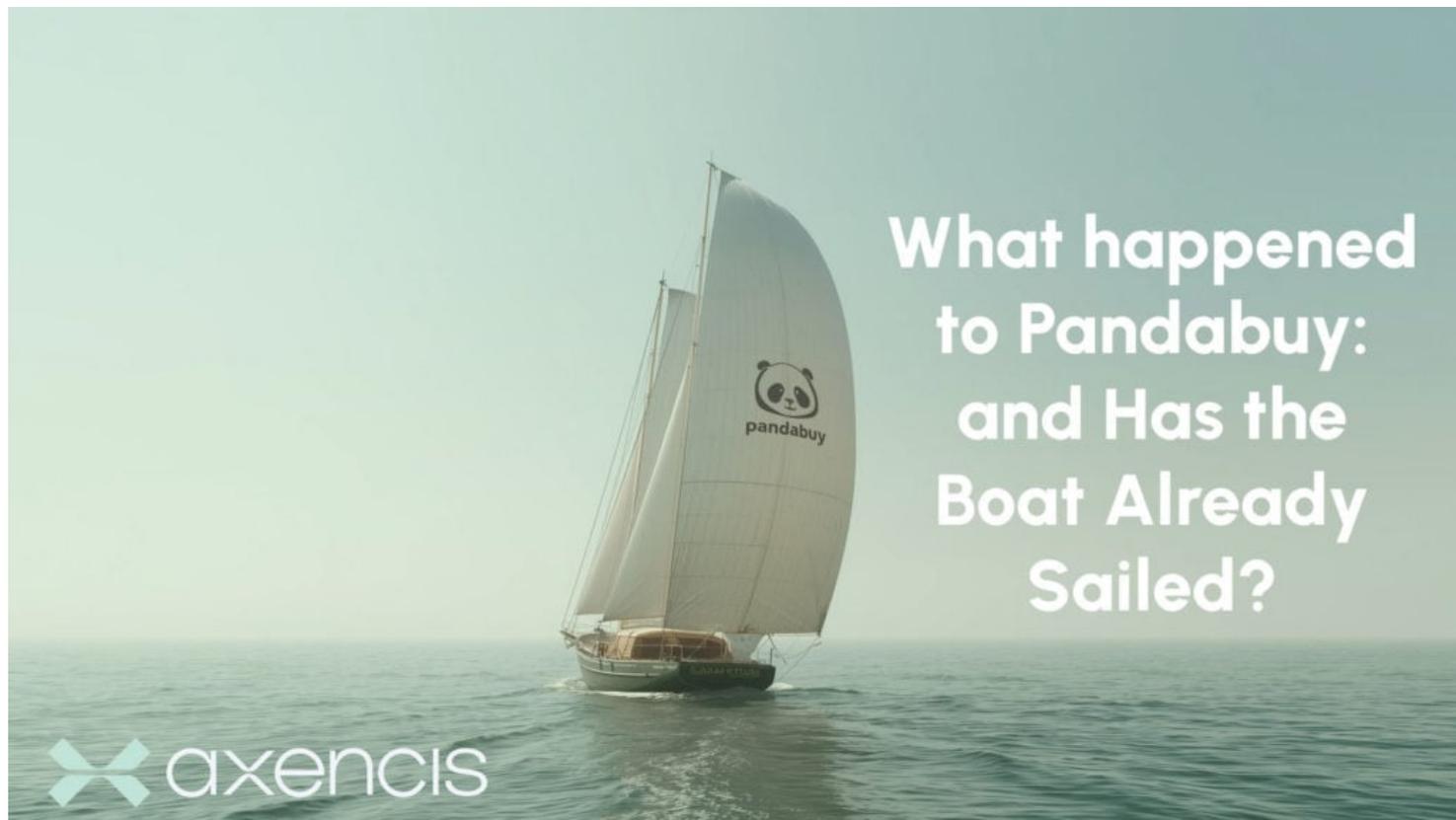


The Pandabuy Saga: The 2025 Guide and alternatives

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Is Pandabuy Back? The Current State After the 2024 Raids

The question “is pandabuy back?” trends across social media platforms as consumers and brands seek clarity on the shopping platform’s status. The massive pandabuy raid occurred in April 2024 when Chinese authorities seized millions of parcels containing counterfeit goods. Pandabuy recently achieved a legal victory in January 2025 when a U.S. court dissolved a \$16 million asset freeze. However, the platform remains effectively disrupted. The pandabuy raid revealed the scale of the problem when authorities discovered warehouses spanning “nearly 20 football stadiums’ worth” of space. These warehouses contained hundreds of thousands of counterfeit sneakers and other branded products. Moreover, this massive operation employed over 2,200 workers across five Chinese cities.

The Pandabuy case shows how traditional trademark protection services struggle with facilitator platforms that operate differently than direct sellers.
